



A Unique Celebration 

Every January, tourists from around the world gather in Pasto, a small city in southern Colombia. Why? For a very special event: The Blacks and Whites' Carnival. This festival is so important that in 2009, UNESCO recognized it as part of the Intangible Cultural Heritage. 

This gigantic party lasts for six days, but there are two main events celebrated on January the 5th and 6th. The first one is the Blacks' Day, in which people paint their faces or their whole body in black and go out to the streets shouting: "¡Que vivan los Negros!" Then the Whites' Day is celebrated with a 15-kilometer enormous parade. That day, people paint themselves in white to celebrate diversity with dance and music. 

If you are planning to start the year in Colombia, you should not miss this wonderful traditional event. I can assure you it will be an incredible experience!
